American Montessori Society (AMS) and Middle States (CES-MSA) Reaccreditation Visit

Over the past year, WMS has engaged in a self-study required for reaccreditation by the AMS and Middle States. As part of this process, a school spends time examining itself in light of its own philosophy with involvement by all of its constituents. This process began several years ago with the visioning and long-range planning that the Board and school community embarked on in 2007. This year, the school completed a self-study related to how we address the standards of AMS and Middle States. Those interested in examining the process and results of the WMS self-study can find them documented in notebooks placed in the front lobby.

With the self-study complete, WMS now looks forward to the visit in anticipation of reaccreditation. During November 14-17, the AMS-Middle States team will visit our school to confirm the self study and follow up with any questions. During that week, you might see the visiting team in hallways and classrooms. They will also attend the Town Meeting on November 16th. We hope you will come prepared with thoughtful insights about our school.
