MTAD and WMS welcome guest educator Betty Garner

The Montessori Teachers' Association of Delaware (MTAD) is pleased to welcome Dr. Betty Garner to Wilmington Montessori School for both a parent workshop (February 17, 7-9 p.m.) and an in-service teachers' conference (February 18, 8 a.m.-3:30 p.m.).

During her presentations, Dr. Garner, a Montessori parent, educator and educational researcher, will draw upon her experiences as an art teacher during which she watched intelligent, creative children decide that they didn't "get what it took" to be successful in school.

Dr. Garner explored the work of a variety of educational psychologists and researchers and conducted hundreds of in-depth case studies, much like Maria Montessori observing children, to better understand how children learn and process information.

In the introduction to her book, Dr. Garner writes, "The students taught me to see learning in a new way." As she explored the development of children's cognitive structures, she also developed a philosophy of the "spiritual dimensions of learning."

Learning Together workshops starting in February!

WMS toddler teacher Holly Knox leads an innovative parenting class that focuses on forming a learning partnership between very young children – ages 3 months to 3 and a half years – and the adults who care for them.

Learning Together consists of two-hour classes that meet weekly in a prepared classroom, plus one adult night and one family event. During classes, a "learning team" consisting of a child and adult (parent, grandparent, or consistent caregiver) explore the Montessori environment together. Through thoughtful observation participants quickly learn about these children's likes and dislikes, personality traits and special qualities that make each a unique individual.
