



### **Calling All Moms!**

**Tuesday, May 3rd is Moms' Day at WMS.**

Stay for a classroom visit at drop-off and then visit the Great Room for our guest speaker, Dr. Beth Grosshans, experienced child psychologist and author of *Beyond Time-Out: From Chaos to Calm, New Strategies for Effective Parenting in Challenging Times*.



In the past few years, a rising cry of distress has been coming from children and parents across the country. The popular press is filled with descriptions of these epidemic family woes where too many parents are embroiled in day to day struggles with their children that are both exhausting and maddening.

Dr. Grosshans knows parents are desperate not only for explanations, but for answers that work. She has developed a simple, yet highly effective five-step strategy that goes *Beyond Time-Out* — all the way to effectiveness.

After our guest speaker, our elementary students will perform at our French Assembly in the Gym at 11:15 a.m. The 5-9 students will perform The Three Little Pigs in French. The performance will also feature six of the 9-12 students as the big bad wolf. Hope to see you there!
